## Why Become a DHANP?

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When you become a Diplomate, you will join a community of colleagues committed to the growth and development of classical homeopathy. You can contribute your skills and expertise through mentoring other homeopaths, participating as a member of the Board of Directors, writing cases for our journal, *Simillimum*, presenting cases at the HANP Case Conference and perhaps most importantly, providing service to the people who call, email or visit our website each year looking for a physician certified in homeopathy.

As more managed care companies awaken to the benefits of homeopathy, they look for a credentialed practitioner who is licensed and certified. Becoming a Diplomate pledges credibility and quality.

Your contribution as a professional homeopath to the science of homeopathy and to the naturopathic profession is crucial. Becoming a Diplomate of the HANP is one way to fulfill that calling. Everyone has something to teach from his or her experience in practice -- and a responsibility to do so. We look forward to learning what you have to share.

### The HANP and CHC

The HANP cooperates with the Council for Homeopathic Certification (CHC) in the use of their exams, and case review. The completion of the DHANP process results in dual certification as a Diplomate of the HANP, and as a CCH, Certified Classical Homeopath by the CHC. Pay special attention to the exam dates, and application deadlines which correspond to those of the HANP application. Follow the CHC link for important exam information for details on the exam. The link for Case submission requirements is more information to consider. We encourage you to obtain the CHC's The Certification Prep Guide for further details on the exams, and case requirements.

## **Steps to complete the Homeopathic Board Certification Exam**

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We've come up with what we think is an exciting plan to complement your interest in homeopathy and help you complete all the requirements for certification to become a Diplomate of HANP. Here's what we've planned:



**Step One:** Complete the HANP application form and mail or fax it to BOTH the **HANP** and **CHC** offices. Send your *initial* application fee of \$300 to the CHC--*made out to the CHC*.

Please do not email your application. (Total fees: \$100 for application and \$200 each for Part I and Part II exams.) If you are not already a member of HANP, a DHANP, or a FHANP, please send \$35 (\$40 Canadian, \$50 if outside of North America) to the **HANP** so that you can receive *Simillimum*. At this stage you have 2 options:

**Option A:** Document a ND or NMD degree, as graduate of an accredited 4 year naturopathic college, or that you are a 4<sup>th</sup> year student ND/NMD candidate with at least **500 hours** of homeopathic training from either the naturopathic college's homeopathic department (submit college transcript) and/or homeopathic professional educational seminars. Submit 2 letters of recommendation from certified professional homeopaths, one from an active DHANP, and one from another certified professional homeopath who may be another active DHANP, a CCH, DHT, or certified by another national certification organization. Option A allows the applicant to apply to take both Parts I & II of the CHC exams.

**Option B:** Document a ND or NMD degree, as graduate of an accredited 4 year naturopathic college, or that you are a 4<sup>th</sup> year student ND/NMD candidate with at least **250 hours** of homeopathic training from either the naturopathic college's homeopathic department (submit college transcript) and/or homeopathic professional educational seminars. Complete the application form and mail or fax it along with your initial application fee of \$300 to the **CHC** office. *Also, send a **copy** of your application to the HANP.* Submit 2 letters of recommendation from certified professional homeopaths, one from an active DHANP, and one from another certified professional homeopath who may be another active DHANP, a CCH, DHT, or certified by another national certification organization. Option B allows the applicant to apply to take Part I of the CHC exams.

***The HANP will review your application, notify you of its approval, and notify the Council for Homeopathic Certification (CHC) that you are approved to take the CHC Exam Part I and/or Part II depending on the above options.***



**Step Two:**

Arrange for a proctor with the CHC and take the Part I, Multiple Choice Exam, and/or Part II Case Analysis exam administered by the CHC. See their website at for exam dates, proctor and contact info. CHC's toll-free telephone number is 866-242-3399. Proctor fee, if required, is not included, and will be the applicant's responsibility.



**Step Three Option A:** For Option A, once you pass both Part I & II, go to Step Four.



**Step Three Option B:**

The next step in the DHANP process is to document to the HANP an additional 250 hours of training (as a total of 500 is required for DHANP status), pay the CHC \$200 for the Part II examination fee, and schedule a

## **Special Arrangements for Applicants with Disabilities**

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Special testing arrangements may be made for applicants with currently documented visual, hearing, physical, or learning disabilities. Requests for special arrangements should be made as far in advance of the exams as possible, but must be made at least two months prior to the exams.

Applicants requesting that special arrangements be made must submit to the CHC Exam Committee. Please include a letter describing: 1) the nature of your disability and specific requirements you will need, 2) signed letter on official letterhead from a certified specialist documenting your disability.

If it is determined that you require only minor adjustments in the testing environment, you may be able to test under standard conditions. If a need for special arrangements is determined, the CHC Exam Committee will work with the applicant in arranging for a test reader, test recorder, separate testing room, or additional testing time.

1. **Repertory:** short answer or multiple-choice questions
2. **Materia Medica:** multiple-choice, true/false, and matching such as:
  - Items asking for the correct remedy for a complex of symptoms.
  - Keynotes of remedies.
  - Characteristics of a particular remedy.
  - Differentiation between similar remedies.

3. **Case Analysis:** multiple-choice items including:
  - Aggravation
  - Suppression
  - Disruption
  - Incorrect/correct potencies
  - Incurable cases/one-sided cases
  - Proving/partial proving
4. **Philosophy:** multiple-choice items including:
  - Terms and types of cases as used by Hahnemann in the Organon
  - Potencies
  - Guiding Symptoms
  - Posology
5. **Pharmacy:** multiple-choice items including:
  - Definitions
  - Potencies
  - Preparation

## **Guidelines for Cases Submitted**

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Cases should be written with these guidelines in mind and should include:

1. An introductory summary of the case or article. Indicate what aspects of homeopathic knowledge, practice, philosophy, research, history, education, politics, or ethics this case addresses.
2. Key rubrics that were chosen or ignored in case analysis.
3. Principles from the Organon that are illustrated by this case, or guided case analysis.
4. Some discussion of Materia Medica for the remedy or remedies prescribed.

5. Some comparative Materia Medica with discussion of other remedies, why they were considered, and why they were not prescribed in the case.
6. Insight into the reasoning processes used in determining treatment plans and remedies, and how and why remedy sequences were chosen. In particular, include insights into difficulties or problems encountered.

Please submit your cases on electronic media; either Macintosh or IBM format is acceptable. They can also be submitted via the Internet to [info@hanp.net](mailto:info@hanp.net). If neither of these options is viable, please submit your articles on laser printed copy, at least 12-point type, with 1-inch margins.

If you have any questions about how to submit cases, contact the HANP office. For examples of cases, *Simillimum* offers multiple illustrations of case analysis and presentation. The CHC's Certification Prep Guide is another resource

## HBCE: Oral Evaluation Criteria

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The DHANP you select to give your oral exam will review your cases and talk with you about two major areas: case analysis and your work habits and interpersonal skills. The following areas of practice will be discussed, and your performance will be rated as excellent, acceptable or poor. If you don't have our Directory of Diplomates, just give us a call and we'll drop one in the mail.

### ***Case Recording and Analysis***

- **Taking the Case:** Information complete, in patient's own words, totality of symptoms
- **Symptom Evaluation:** Symptoms ranked in order of importance, knows repertory
- **Case Analysis:** Understands seriousness of case, center of case, role of miasm and history, knowledge of Materia Medica
- **First Prescription:** Identified the simillimum, correct potency, gave single remedy
- **Follow-up Interview:** Determined action of 1<sup>st</sup> prescription: energy level, change in chief complaint, change in mental and emotional, new symptoms, aggravations
- **Long Term Management:** Timing of remedy is appropriate, waits to prescribe until symptom picture clear, understands layers
- **Problem Solving:** Able to interpret complications and challenges and prescribe appropriately

### ***Work Habits and Interpersonal Skills***

- **Tolerance for stress:** Stable under pressure
- **Practical learning:** Assimilates and applies new information
- **Work standards:** High goals, above average
- **Sensitivity:** Understanding without judging
- **Behavioral Flexibility:** Modifying behavior while maintaining effectiveness
- **Integrity:** Uses ethics under pressure
- **Judgment and Decisiveness:** Taking action based on logical assumptions, facts
- **Communication Skills:** Able to listen and respond effectively
- **Motivation to Serve:** Demonstrated desire to meet needs of patients and profession
- **Leadership:** Uses appropriate methods to gain group agreement and action
- **Self Awareness:** Understands strengths, limitations and growth process
